# Seniors are often the targets of unscrupulous people.

#### Did you know

- One in 10 Americans age 60+ experienced abuse over one year, and many experience it in multiple forms (*Acierno*, 2010; *Lifespan of Greater Rochester*, *Inc.*, 2011)
- Elder abuse is underreported. The New York State Elder Abuse Prevalence Study found that for every elder abuse case known to programs and agencies, 23.5 were unknown (Lifespan of Greater Rochester, Inc., 2011)
- Spouses and family members are most often the abusers of older adults
- The average age of victims of elder abuse is 77.9 years

#### **Types of Abuse**

Physical Abuse - use of physical force that can result in bodily injury, physical pain or impairment

Sexual Abuse - non-consensual sexual contact of any kind with an elderly person

Financial Exploitation - illegal or improper use of a senior's funds, property or assets

Neglect - the refusal or failure to fulfill any part of a person's obligations or duties to an older person

Emotional Abuse - infliction of anguish, pain, or distress through verbal or nonverbal acts

Abandonment - the desertion of an elderly person by an individual who has physical custody of him/her or by a person who has assumed responsibility for providing care to him/her
