From the Directors Desk

Dear Alumni,


t is hard to believe that almost one year later, we are still talking about the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic. The pandemic has changed the way we run the school of nursing, but it is safe to say, we are adapting to the new norm, while still trying to determine what the new norm is!

Samaritan Hospital, along with St. Peter's Hospital have weathered the second COVID surge. The second surge was far more dramatic and significant than the first surge. The inpatient COVID + numbers rose extremely high. Staff members testing + for COVID created holes in staffing. We have been fortunate to have our LPN, Nursing II and Nursing V students in clinical, despite the surge. The students are working on non-COVID floors, always in full PPE (gowns, N95s,

goggles, gloves, etc). The students and faculty have been able to fill gaps in staffing while simultaneously meeting their clinical learning outcomes. The student experience has been extremely rich and rewarding. To be part of the nursing workforce at the bedside providing care during a pandemic is truly a once in a lifetime experience. I could not be more proud of the amazing faculty and eager students who have jumped right in.

In October, the School of Nursing participated in a 4-day virtual site visit with a team from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). I am delighted to share that the visit went extremely well. The recommendation was for continuing accreditation for the maximum length of time, 8 years. Next month, the ACEN Board of Commissioners meets to make the final determination on the site visitor recommendation.

Our December pinning ceremony was small, but meaningful. The graduation was in person, but limited to just the graduates. Family and friends attended virtually through a livestream of the ceremony. The alumni grew by 31 new associate degree graduates in December. Our NCLEX pass rates remain impressively high. New York State and national averages for both programs have dropped precipitously since COVID. These are the most recent pass rates for each program:
