his fall we welcomed a class of 29 Nursing I students and 7 LPN students. It feels good to have the students back in the classrooms and the hallways filled with their voices. Probably the most exciting news, from a student perspective, are the new uniforms! Gone are the old white tops and royal blue or burgundy bottoms. RN students wear black scrubs, and if needed a white lab coat. The LPN students wear a white scrub top and black scrub bottoms. All the students look so sharp!

17 LPN graduates in August. Our NCLEX pass rates remain high, particularly in relation to New York State and the national average. Below are the most recent 1st time new graduate pass rates for each program:

The new test items will test the new graduate's clinical judgment. Faculty have been busy flipping the classrooms, meaning the student does all the textbook learning BEFORE the class, and class time is spent actively applying the learning to case studies, scenarios, and even lab skills. In addition, we are now including these "next generation" type questions on our written exams.

I am very excited to share a welcomed addition to the nursing leadership at the school. Alumna Beverly Stewart has been promoted to Associate Director. Bev now has a lightened teaching load and is assuming more leadership roles in the school of nursing. Bev has extensive experience as the charge nurse in Samaritan's emergency department. So she is more than capable of addressing all the situations and scenarios that develop on the school campus!
