Coordination delivers quality care to mother and son

Eddy Heritage House in Troy stepped up to care for two members of a family at one time...and it all started when a 79-year-old woman arrived at the Samaritan Hospital Emergency Department. She had fallen and broken her hip, but she was also the primary caregiver for her 58-year-old son. Except for a one-hour daily visit from an aide from the Eddy Visiting Nurse & Rehab Association, the son was dependent on his mother for many of the activities of daily living.

Keith Mayhew, an Eddy VNRA home health aide, and Ann Marie Moran, an Eddy VNRA manager, quickly realized the son couldn't live alone, and that started a rapid sequence of coordinated efforts to secure quality care for both mother and son.

While a local relative was called upon to temporarily help with some of the caregiving the son needed, Moran called Ellen Haegele, director of nursing at Eddy Heritage House to check on the availability of a respite bed. That first day after the fall, Moran




made a home visit to begin pre-admission screening, and arranged for him to see his doctor for additional screening that same day. Michelle Bell, an Eddy VNRA RN case manager, visited the house a couple days later to read the results of a required TB test.

In the meantime, staff at Eddy Heritage House made sure the son would have his stay covered by insurance. And just three days after the mother went there to begin her rehab, the son arrived there as well. His presence helped her heal: she was able to go through rehab knowing he was safe.

The mother was discharged home first to give her time to settle in, then five days later he came home and his daily aide visits resumed. At the same time, she started six weeks of physical and occupational therapy, also provided by Eddy VNRA.

Today, thanks to care coordination efforts at Samaritan, Eddy VNRA and Eddy Heritage House, both mother and son remain at home and are doing well!



Cardiac patients who have symptoms that are not life threatening no longer have to wait for an appointment with a specialist! The Same Day Heart Clinic at Albany Associates in Cardiology (AAC), 2 Palisades Drive in Albany, accepts walk-ins on a first-come, first-serve basis weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.





The Same Day Heart Clinic, which began welcoming patients January 15 of this year, always has one of AAC's 20 staff cardiologists available to assist patients. Besides a visit with a doctor, the clinic can provide cardiac assessment and diagnostics.

For people with severe symptoms the walk-in clinic is not a substitute for a visit to the emergency room. But the clinic can provide a variety of services in a timely fashion such as reviews of a primary care provider's EKG, analysis of what may seem to be a reaction to medication and clearance for surgery. Same day advanced imaging (echocardiogram, stress tests, and nuclear stress tests) is available to patients (pending insurance approval).
