From the Director's Desk Dear Alumni,

The cool nighttime temperatures mean autumn is in the air and so too the return to school. Samaritan Hospital School of Nursing welcomed back 140 students including 29 first time nursing students in Nursing I.

Graduations in May and August contributed 44 more alumni to the ranks.

New York State is the first and only state to pass legislation requiring that nurses earn a bachelor's degree within 10 years of obtaining registered nurse licensure. The focus on getting more RNs prepared at the bachelor's degree level has renewed our discussions with the College of St. Rose. We are actively working on a 1+2+1 program with the College. In this model, St. Rose nursing students would complete a number of their general education and science courses in year 1 of the degree plan. In the 2nd and 3rd year, the students spend their time attending Samaritan's nursing program, completing their associate degree and taking the NCLEX-RN. In the 4th year, the student is back at St. Rose finishing their bachelors in nursing with an option to work part-time as an RN in the St. Peter's Health Partners system. Stay tuned for more news on this exciting venture.

Our Learning Lab receives a great deal of use from the students. In addition to regularly scheduled lab time, many students come and practice on their own to master skills and build confidence. We are steadily replacing equipment that becomes old or non-functional with newer state of the art equipment. Our latest purchase was two workstations on wheels or WOWs. The ergonomically designed rolling carts hold new laptops on the top surface. Our next item on the list is a pyxis machine. This would help students build comfort and confidence with the technology needed to safely pass medications.

The Student Government Association has held its first meeting and is identifying areas to focus their energies for the coming year.

If you are in the area of the school – stop in! Our door is always open and students enjoy meeting alumni.
